Who we are

Curiosity Collider Art-Science Foundation is a Vancouver based non-profit organization that is committed to providing opportunities for artists whose work expresses scientific concepts and scientists who collaborate with artists. We challenge the perception and experience of art and science in our culture, break down the traditional walls between art and science, and engage our growing community to bring life to the concepts that describe our world.

Artists and scientists seek new knowledge, challenge our understanding of experiences, and share their findings. Curiosity Collider fosters the link between the arts and sciences, which are better understood as part of the same spectrum. Like art, the practice of science involves the pursuit of new understanding. Scientists are moved by the language of data. Artists have unique abilities to mine and translate that data into artworks that express the human experience, creating accessibility to science concepts for diverse groups.

Art humanises abstract and complex ideas, increases critical thinking abilities, and creates a memorable experience for the viewer. Art and science are for everyone, so we incorporate interactive elements for each event. This includes activities such as workshops, demonstrations, and interactive installations which increase opportunities for engagement, and reinforce how art and science together improve and enrich our everyday lives.

Curiosity Collider promotes interdisciplinary collaborations that capture natural human curiosity. At the intersection of art, culture, technology, and science are innovative ways to explore the boundaries of human understanding, appreciation, and experience of the world. Collide with us and help create new ways to think, feel, and do.

CC Growth Strategies

2018 - 2019 [short-term strategies]

Outreach

- Create a year-over-year infographic on what percentage of our annual budget goes to our community of creators.
- Put our vision statement and a mechanism to donate together on our website and other outreach channels.
- Determine which analytics platform will best inform us of our target audience and market (feeds into funding by sponsorship). Survey our email list once a year to see how many events they attended.
- Tell more stories: engage a volunteer photographer/videographer and social media outreach volunteer to document and display our events.

Funding Targets

Set targets for 50% funding from event revenues/fee for service and 50% from grant funding.

- Engage a volunteer Development Director Board member.
- Choose two or three recurring primary grant applications that best align with our values.
- Choose two or three corporate sponsors or partners with mandates that align with our values imagine a sponsorship package they would say 'yes' to. Create and post a downloadable version on our website.
- Develop our annual Collisions Festival branding event profile.



2020 - 2021 [long-term strategies]

Collisions Festival Competition

- Build an annual competition into our Collisions Festival event to drive early engagement and more public involvement.
 - Define the competition and tie it to a partner or sponsor
 - Live elements? Interactive? People's Choice awards.
 - Judging metrics also attractive to partner or sponsor
 - Showcase for the winning submissions.

Physical Space for our Growing Community

• Continue to seek a physical space (shared/co-op?) for our community to work together on collaborative projects and to inspire each other.

Our Structure: Board of Directors

Following the transition to the New BC Society Act (in full effect Nov 2018), board members must be volunteers but can be paid at fair market value for additional project-based roles.

Key Roles

Community Engagement Director Operations Director Arts, Culture, & Collections Director Development Director Creative Director (non-board role, intended to be paid on a project basis)

Requirements/expectations for Board Members:

- Demonstrate passion for inclusive interdisciplinary collaborations that promote new ways to experience art & science.
- Provide unique community perspectives, potential contacts, or accessibility to channels or resources that foster growth of the foundation.
- Commit to participation and engagement in developing events and strategies to further the foundation.
 - Keep looking for potential board members or volunteers with similar values.
 - Seek out grants and corporate funding opportunities, ensuring no conflict of interest.
